What is RTI?

"Multi-step approach
to providing services and interventions
to students who struggle with learning
at various levels of intensity"

(NCLD, 2006)



RTI is not about general education or special education—

It is about ALL education

RTI is NOT a replacement for pre-referral interventions

RTI as School-wide Prevention Model

Provide all students with a research-based,
 core instruction

Identify struggling students early

Provide supplemental interventions to struggling students and monitor their progress



Tier II

Evidence-based intervention(s) of moderate intensity that address the learning or behavior challenges of most at-risk students

Tier I

High-quality core instruction that meets the needs of most students

Tier III

Individualized intervention(s) of increased intensity for students who show minimal response to secondary prevention

Universal Screening

Identify students who are struggling or at-risk

Progress Monitoring

Assess student academic performance and evaluate effectiveness of instruction.



How is RTI Part of the Identification Process for LD?

- IDEA 2004:
 - PART of the identification process
 - Alternative to the discrepancy model of LD identification
- Data from RTI is not enough
- Parents' right to request a special education evaluation



How Can RTI Benefit Your Child?

- Reduce wait time for instructional assistance
- Provide critical information on instructional needs
- Limit amount of testing
- Ensure students receive appropriate instruction



Questions to ask at your child's school about RTI

- Does the school use RTI for LD identification?
- What screening measures are used? How often are students screened?
- What progress monitoring measures are used? How often are students progress monitored in Tier 1? Tier 2? Tier 3?
- □ How is instruction being differentiated in Tier 1? What interventions are being provided to support struggling students in Tier 2? Tier 3?
